
I look forward to working closely with each of you as we strive to fulfill our mission and create a brighter future for our EOD warriors and their families.

The Women in EOD Ruck and Gala was a special event celebrating the achievements and resilience of women in EOD with a tribute to Linda Cox, the first woman in the field.

The event began with a 4-mile ruck, where participants carried 35-pound rucksacks, symbolizing the physical and mental toughness required in EOD roles. This was followed by a gala at The Island Resort, featuring inspiring speeches, gift presentations, and an evening of food and music.

EOD History Path Est. August 2024

Over the past six months, the Board and Staff of the EOD Warrior Foundation have collaborated closely with NAVSCOLEOD and Eglin AFB's Civil Engineering and Staff to add a significant new feature to the EOD Memorial Grounds. Along the gravel path that connects the EOD Memorial to the Remembrance Garden, we have erected four pillars adorned with the original cenotaphs from the EOD Memorial's initial construction at Eglin AFB on March 17, 1999.

On the northern side of the path, three of these monuments narrate the "History of EOD," detailing our legacy from its inception in 1941 to current and future operations. The southern side of the path features the fourth and final pillar, which chronicles the history of the EOD Memorial itself. This pillar provides an account of the original memorial established at Indian Head, MD, in the 1970s, the subsequent transition of NAVSCOLEOD to Eglin AFB, and the relocation of the Memorial to its present site adjacent to the School House. The dedication of this new addition took place on August 9, 2024, with a ribbon-cutting ceremony attended by community members, the Niceville City Council, and highlighted by remarks from our Chairman, Mr. Greg K. Mittelman and Executive Director, Jerry Shelton.

This addition to the Memorial Grounds stands as a lasting tribute to our EOD history and heritage. Crafted from rock and bronze, these pillars are a permanent reminder of those who came before us, those who made the ultimate sacrifice, and those who left us too soon. As the next generation of service members from all branches train across the street, they will continue our tradition of protecting others and preventing the loss of life, grounded in the enduring legacy of EOD.

Removing the Stigma

a series of talks surrounding mental health







The Power of Conversation: Removing the Stigma-Alaska

In our ongoing commitment to fostering a supportive community, the EOD Warrior Foundation recently traveled to Alaska to host "Removing the Stigma," a powerful panel discussion focused on mental health and suicide awareness within the EOD community. This event brought together experts in mental health, community-based support resources, and included testimonials from EOD Techs who courageously shared their personal struggles with mental health.

Discussions at the event included the ongoing EOD Mental Health Survey, which was launched earlier this year with the aim of gaining a deeper understanding of the mental health landscape within our community. Additional conversations addressed Operator Syndrome, a lesser-known and complex condition affecting many EOD Techs. The discussions also highlighted how the isolation from friends and family experienced while living in Alaska can negatively impact mental well-being. Various programs, ranging from mental health support to recreational activities, were explored as potential solutions for supporting Techs.

Perhaps the most powerful moments came from EOD Techs who shared their own mental health journeys, reminding the audience of the profound impact that reaching out to others can have. They emphasized how opening up about struggles not only aids personal healing but also encourages others to offer their support, creating a stronger, more connected community.

As we reflect on the powerful stories and insights shared during the panel, we are reminded that removing stigma is an ongoing journey. It requires each of us to be active participants in fostering a culture of understanding and acceptance. We encourage all members of our community to continue these conversations, challenge stigma when they see it, and support those who are affected.
